LEADER: What is the third commandment?

ALL: **The third commandment is, You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain, for the LORD will not hold him guiltless who takes his name in vain.**

LEADER: What does the third commandment require?

ALL: **The third commandment requires the holy and reverent use in our thoughts, meditations, words, and writings, of God's name, titles, qualities, regulations, word, sacraments, prayer, oaths, vows, casting lots, his works, and anything else by which he makes himself known. This treatment will be reflected in holy affirmations of our faith and conduct that matches our affirmations, to the glory of God and the good of ourselves and others.**

take hold of the forgiveness won for us by Christ, our Redeemer.*
