

by promises, prophecies, sacrifices, circumcision, the Passover, and other symbols and ordinances, all of which foreshadowed the Christ to come and were sufficient for that time to build up the chosen ones in faith in the promised Messiah, by whom they then

had full remission of sin and eternal salvation.

LEADER: How is the covenant of grace administered under the New Covenant?

ALL: Under the New Covenant, when Christ was exhibited as the true

substance of what had been previously foreshadowed, the same covenant of grace was and still is to be administered in the preaching of the Word and the administration of the sacraments of baptism and the Lord's Supper, in which grace and salvation are

held forth in more fullness, evidence, and effectiveness to all

nations.
