

CALL TO CONFESSION OF SIN

Westminster Larger Catechism Q&A 150; Luke 12:47–48

LEADER: Are all transgressions of the law of God equally heinous in themselves, and

in the sight of God?

ALL: All transgressions of the law of God are not equally heinous; but

some sins in themselves, and by reason of several aggravations,

are more heinous in the sight of God than others.

LEADER: "And that servant who knew his master's will but did not get ready or act

according to his will, will receive a severe beating. But the one who did not

know, and did what deserved a beating, will receive a light beating. Everyone to whom much was given, of him much will be required, and from him to whom they entrusted much, they will demand the more."

Hymn 80 (vv 1-4)

Matthew 11:20-24

Then he began to denounce the cities where most of his mighty works had been done, because they did not repent. ²¹ "Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida! For if the mighty works done in you had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago in sackcloth and ashes. ²² But I tell you, it will be more bearable on the day of judgment for Tyre and Sidon than for you. ²³ And you, Capernaum, will you be exalted to heaven? You will be brought down to Hades. For if the mighty works done in you had been done in Sodom, it would have remained until this day. ²⁴ But I tell you that it will be more tolerable on the day of judgment for the land of Sodom than for you."
