

ASSURANCE OF FORGIVENESS


1 Peter 2:22-24

Psalm 37

Of David.

Fret not yourself because of evildoers; be not envious of wrongdoers!

- ² For they will soon fade like the grass and wither like the green herb.
- ³ Trust in the LORD, and do good; dwell in the land and befriend faithfulness.
- Delight yourself in the LORD, and he will give you the desires of your heart.
- ⁵ Commit your way to the LORD; trust in him, and he will act.
- ⁶ He will bring forth your righteousness as the light, and your justice as the noonday.
- Be still before the LORD and wait patiently for him; fret not yourself over the one who prospers in his way, over the man who carries out evil devices!
- 8 Refrain from anger, and forsake wrath! Fret not yourself; it tends only to evil.
- 9 For the evildoers shall be cut off, but those who wait for the LORD shall inherit the land.
- In just a little while, the wicked will be no more; though you look carefully at his place, he will not be there.
- ¹¹ But the meek shall inherit the land and delight themselves in abundant peace.
- ¹² The wicked plots against the righteous and gnashes his teeth at him,

- but the Lord laughs at the wicked, for he sees that his day is coming.
- The wicked draw the sword and bend their bows to bring down the poor and needy, to slay those whose way is upright;
- their sword shall enter their own heart, and their bows shall be broken.
- ¹⁶ Better is the little that the righteous has than the abundance of many wicked.
- ¹⁷ For the arms of the wicked shall be broken, but the LORD upholds the righteous.
- The LORD knows the days of the blameless, and their heritage will remain forever;
- they are not put to shame in evil times; in the days of famine they have abundance.
- ²⁰ But the wicked will perish; the enemies of the LORD are like the glory of the pastures; they vanish—like smoke they vanish away.
- The wicked borrows but does not pay back, but the righteous is generous and gives;
- ²² for those blessed by the LORD shall inherit the land, but those cursed by him shall be cut off.
- The steps of a man are established by the LORD, when he delights in his way;
- though he fall, he shall not be cast headlong, for the LORD upholds his hand.
- I have been young, and now am old, yet I have not seen the righteous forsaken or his children begging for bread.
- He is ever lending generously, and his children become a blessing.

- ²⁷ Turn away from evil and do good; so shall you dwell forever.
- For the LORD loves justice;he will not forsake his saints.They are preserved forever,but the children of the wicked shall be cut off.
- ²⁹ The righteous shall inherit the land and dwell upon it forever.
- The mouth of the righteous utters wisdom, and his tongue speaks justice.
- The law of his God is in his heart; his steps do not slip.
- The wicked watches for the righteous and seeks to put him to death.
- ³³ The LORD will not abandon him to his power or let him be condemned when he is brought to trial.
- Wait for the LORD and keep his way, and he will exalt you to inherit the land; you will look on when the wicked are cut off.
- ³⁵ I have seen a wicked, ruthless man, spreading himself like a green laurel tree.
- ³⁶ But he passed away, and behold, he was no more; though I sought him, he could not be found.
- Mark the blameless and behold the upright, for there is a future for the man of peace.
- ³⁸ But transgressors shall be altogether destroyed; the future of the wicked shall be cut off.
- ³⁹ The salvation of the righteous is from the LORD; he is their stronghold in the time of trouble.
- 40 The LORD helps them and delivers them; he delivers them from the wicked and saves them, because they take refuge in him.

1 Samuel 24:1-22

When Saul returned from following the Philistines, he was told, "Behold, David is in the wilderness of Engedi." ² Then Saul took three thousand chosen men out of all Israel and went to seek David and his men in front of the Wildgoats' Rocks. ³ And he came to the sheepfolds by the way, where there was a cave, and Saul went in to relieve himself. Now David and his men were sitting in the innermost parts of the cave. ⁴ And the men of David said to him, "Here is the day of which the LORD said to you, 'Behold, I will give your enemy into your hand, and you shall do to him as it shall seem good to you." Then David arose and stealthily cut off a corner of Saul's robe. ⁵ And afterward David's heart struck him, because he had cut off a corner of Saul's robe. ⁶ He said to his men, "The LORD forbid that I should do this thing to my lord, the LORD's anointed, to put out my hand against him, seeing he is the LORD's anointed." ⁷ So David persuaded his men with these words and did not permit them to attack Saul. And Saul rose up and left the cave and went on his way.

⁸ Afterward David also arose and went out of the cave, and called after Saul, "My lord the king!" And when Saul looked behind him, David bowed with his face to the earth and paid homage. 9 And David said to Saul, "Why do you listen to the words of men who say, 'Behold, David seeks your harm'? ¹⁰ Behold, this day your eyes have seen how the LORD gave you today into my hand in the cave. And some told me to kill you, but I spared you. I said, 'I will not put out my hand against my lord, for he is the LORD's anointed.' 11 See, my father, see the corner of your robe in my hand. For by the fact that I cut off the corner of your robe and did not kill you, you may know and see that there is no wrong or treason in my hands. I have not sinned against you, though you hunt my life to take it. 12 May the LORD judge between me and you, may the LORD avenge me against you, but my hand shall not be against you. 13 As the proverb of the ancients says, 'Out of the wicked comes wickedness.' But my hand shall not be against you. 14 After whom has the king of Israel come out? After whom do you pursue? After a dead dog! After a flea! 15 May the LORD therefore be judge and give sentence between me and you, and see to it and plead my cause and deliver me from your hand."

Hymn 311—Hail to the Lord's Anointed (vv. 1-4)





And Saul lifted up his voice and wept. ¹⁷ He said to David, "You are more righteous than I, for you have repaid me good, whereas I have repaid you evil. ¹⁸ And you have declared this day how you have dealt well with me, in that you did not kill me when the LORD put me into your hands. ¹⁹ For if a man finds his enemy, will he let him go away safe? So may the LORD reward you with good for what you have done to me this day. ²⁰ And now, behold, I know that you shall surely be king, and that the kingdom of Israel shall be established in your hand. ²¹ Swear to me therefore by the LORD that you will not cut off my offspring after me, and that you will not destroy my name out of my father's house." ²² And David swore this to Saul. Then Saul went home, but David and his men went up to the stronghold.
