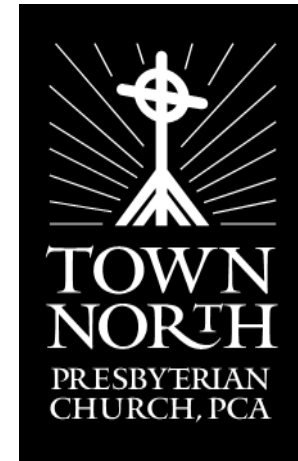

CALL TO CONFESSION OF SIN

Westminster Larger Catechism Q&A 146-148
(Modern English Version)

LEADER: What is the tenth commandment?

ALL: **The tenth commandment is: You shall not covet your neighbor's house. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his manservant or maidservant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.**

LEADER: What does the tenth commandment require?

ALL: **The tenth commandment requires that we be so completely satisfied with our own status in life and have such a proper, loving attitude toward others that we are naturally inclined to wish the best for them and all their possessions.**

LEADER: What particular sins does the tenth commandment forbid?

ALL: **The tenth commandment forbids any dissatisfaction with what belongs to us, envy and grief at the success of others, and all improper desire for anything that belongs to someone else.**

CORPORATE CONFESSION OF SIN

ALL: **O Lord, you command us to cease coveting what does not belong to us. We confess that we have broken your commandment. We are prone to be dissatisfied with our possessions, with our spouses, with our coworkers, with our friends, with our bodies and with our allotted situations in life. Lord, we lack contentment with the things that you have given, and even with you, the giver!**

Forgive us and pour out your healing grace upon us that we would find true satisfaction in you. In the name of Christ we pray, Amen.

SILENT CONFESSION OF SIN

In these moments, we individually come to God in prayer, silently confessing personal sins so that we may take hold of the forgiveness won for us by Christ, our Redeemer.

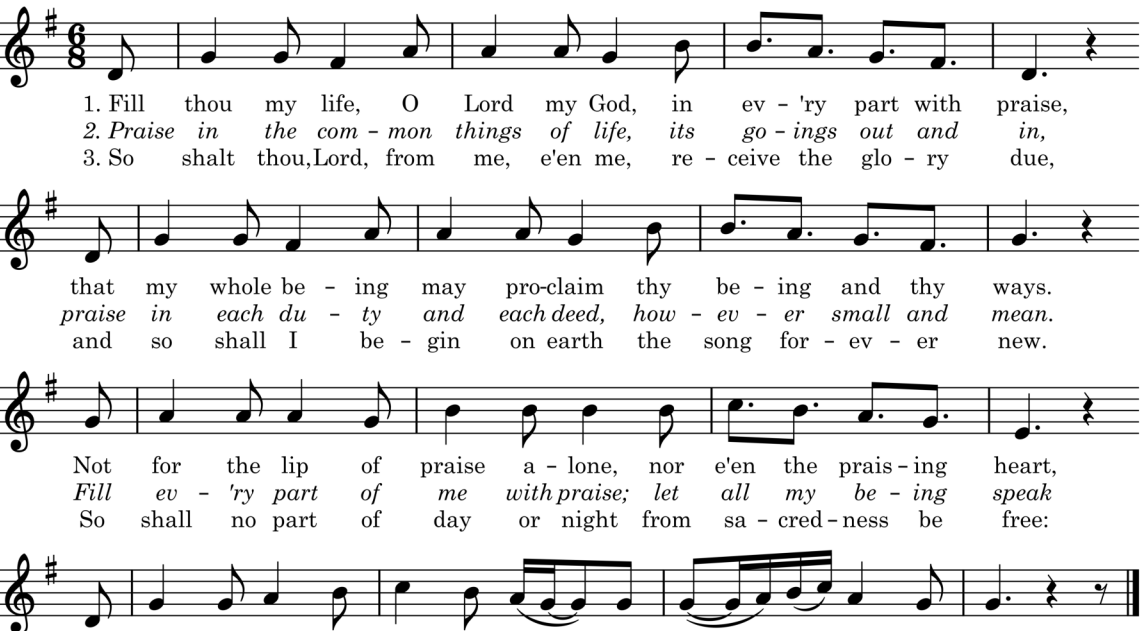
